Parent Right to Know

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Ivy Preparatory Young Men's Leadership Academy is committed to providing quality instruction for all students and does so by employing the most qualified individuals to teach and support each student in the classroom. We have worked diligently to assure that every class has a teacher with the appropriate background, experience, and credentials for his or her teaching assignment. We believe that a caring, competent, and qualified teacher for every child is the most important ingredient in educational reform.

The Elementary & Secondary Education Act (ESEA), formerly known as No Child Left Behind law (NCLB) requires school districts to notify parents of their right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct their child. Specifically, you have the right to request the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the teacher has met the Georgia Professional Standards Commission requirements for certification for the grade level and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which Georgia qualifications or certification criteria have been waived;
- The college major and any graduate certification or degree held by the teacher;
- Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications.
